Precautionary Statements

Prevention: Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames, hot surfaces - no smoking. Keep container tightly

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air in case of accidental inhalation of vapours. Administer

oxygen or artificial respiration as needed. If symptoms develop and persist,

get medical attention.

Skin contact: Immediately wash skin thoroughly with soap and water. If symptoms develop

and persist, get medical attention.

Eye contact: Immediately flush eyes with water for at least 15 minutes, while holding

eyelids open. Seek medical attention at once.

Ingestion: Get immediate medical attention. Do not induce vomiting.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Water spray (fog), foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.
